The WEEE Forum, the voice of thirty WEEE producer compliance schemes in Europe, last year collecting and responsibly recycling to the highest standards 1.88 million tonnes of e-waste, will celebrate 15 years of excellence as a leader in this sector. Malta is the perfect spot for these celebrations because, in the first half of the year, Malta is at the helm of the EU Council of Ministers. A special conference of the WEEE Forum will be held on 26-27 April 2017, in the fringe of a meeting of the Environment Ministers, which will be chaired by Commissioner Karmenu Vella, a Maltese national. The WEEE Forum has been successful in securing the Commissioner's and senior officials' support and participation in the conference. WEEE Malta, our youngest member organisation, has kindly offered to host the conference and we are their distinguished guests.





At a glance

For the past 15-20 years, the producer responsibility organisations in the WEEE Forum have been at the forefront, in Europe and across the world, in turning the extended producer responsibility principle into a workable and effective policy approach. Since 2002 the WEEE Forum compliance schemes have worked on behalf of over 16.000 producers of electrical appliances to collect, recycle and recover to the highest treatment standards more than 17.4 million tonnes of waste electrical and electronic equipment; that's the equivalent of 17.400 Eiffel Towers. In doing so, the WEEE Forum compliance schemes have worked alongside the producers and recycling operators towards the development of a European economy that is more resource efficient and sustainable but further progress needs to be made for a circular economy to become a reality.

The International WEEE Forum Conference takes place in "Le Méridien St Julians Hotel & Spa" (see http://www.lemeridienmalta.com). Address: 39 Main Street, Balluta Bay, St Julians STJ1017, Malta.

A group rate of €145 for rooms in Le Méridien until 1 March has been secured. After that date, rates will be subject to availability.





Delegations

This conference is 'upon invitation only' and the maximum capacity of the conference room in theatre style is 140. This means that, on average, each WEEE system's delegation consists of approximately 4-5 senior executives. The WEEE Forum secretariat's contingent is 10-15 delegates, and there should also be scope to invite a few journalists.

The entry fee is €875 per delegate. Spouses of conference delegates who only attend the Gala Dinner will pay an extra €125.

In order to ensure the WEEE Forum recovers the cost of the conference and is not exposed to any financial shortfall it is important that we have your support for this event. We respectfully request the co-ordinators of the WEEE system delegations to reply by 1 March to pascal.leroy@weee-forum.org confirming the number and identity of delegates from your organisation. We will, on the basis of the number of delegates communicated to us, assess whether or not there is scope to add delegates for those who wish to enlarge their delegation to more than four (to balance those that choose to have smaller delegations). The numbers will be firmed up and communicated to each of you by 17 March.

Once the size of WEEE system delegations is known, we will invite the co-ordinators to register their delegations via the conference website [to be communicated shortly]. Based on the website registrations, the WEEE Forum secretariat will send invoices to the WEEE systems (not to the individual delegates) We respectfully ask the WEEE system co-ordinator to make your financial transaction to the WEEE Forum conference bank account [details to be confirmed] on or, preferably, before 24 March. This will be non-refundable and you are then free to bring up to the number of delegates that you have secured. If one or more members of your delegation is subsequently unable to attend you can substitute as you wish, but don't forget to notify us in case of a replacement, so we can do the necessary name changes.

The team in Brussels is dealing with registration and the agenda, whilst the team of Joe Attard at WEEE Malta is responsible for logistics and service providers.
