Mission Innovation Champions Timeline

10 September 2018: Registration Deadline

Before submitting an application, individuals must first <u>register</u> and confirm that registration no later than 10 September 2018 at 5:00 PM GMT.

10 October 2018: Submission Deadline

Once registration has closed, registrants will have an additional one month to complete their applications. All applications are due through the online application on the website by 10 October 2018 at 5:00 PM GMT.

11 October – 14 November 2018: Peer-to-Peer Review

Over a period of one month, each participant will score and comment upon five applications from other applicants, using a trait scoring rubric.

15 November – 5 December 2018: Administrative Review

Over a period of three weeks, staff will review submissions to ensure that they comply with the application requirements and rules.

6 December 2018 – 31 January 2019: Evaluation Panel Review

During this period, the Evaluation Panel judges will score and comment on the top-scoring submissions as determined by the Peer-to-Peer Review.

1 – 28 February 2019: Champions Notified

The Mission Innovation Champions will be determined by rank order as determined by the Evaluation Panel in combination with Geographic location.

May 2019: Award Ceremony

Mission Innovation Champions will be invited to attend an award ceremony on May 2019 at the fourth Mission Innovation ministerial meeting in Vancouver, Canada.

One Champion for the European Commission (on behalf of the European Union) will be selected, this being from a European Union country that is not an individual member of Mission Innovation (eligible countries: Belgium, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Ireland, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, and Spain).
